Raising Hope for All Children



Because we are working jointly with St. Luke UMC to begin an affordable childcare facility for low-income families, I think the story of my early life is pertinent to our current discussion.

In 1967, at the age of six, my parents divorced and my mother became a single parent. It was a good thing because my father's alcoholism was causing trauma and financial problems. However, my older siblings had all moved out of the house and gone to college, work, or married. I lost a lot of family in a short period of time and my caregivers. Although I

attended a good public school in the neighborhood and my mom had a government job and health insurance, I was not prepared for school. I didn't know my alphabet or much about numbers. I had also been in a turbulent situation. Often, I felt insecure. I was behind. I suffered from anxiety. I didn't know that's what it was, but I do now. I often walked home and let myself in the house. I would pick up the landline and call my mom or older sister (who had her own family by then) just to let them know I was okay. I also called them because it was sometimes lonely.

Certainly, our situation could have been much worse, but I understand how one sudden life change—a divorce, a job loss, a death—can increase the challenges of our least, our children, and it is not their fault. It's too bad our neighborhood church didn't have a program for me or my mom. Back then, I believe too many of us thought these problems were not ones the church should tackle because difficult circumstances don't happen to people who are trying hard. I believe now we know better.

- Dr. Seuss Bookfest, March 4 at St. Andrew UMC, serving a number of nearby schools, including Wakefield, which is, of course, our partner in education. Other nearby schools are

- Dia Del Ninos or Day of the Child, **April TBA.** Hosting a celebration of children in the community at St. Luke UMC with St. Luke friends.
- Cooking Matters Help empower children to learn to cook and prepare snacks and meals. (Currently an after school program at Bale Elementary.)
- Summer meals for children and families - Coming Summer 2017.






