


Join Us On Our River Adventures!

This year's event will lead children on an action-packed, whitewater rafting adventure to experience the ride of a lifetime with God! Along the river, children will discover that life with God is an adventure full of wonder and surprise, and that they can trust God to be with them through anything. Music, exciting science, creative crafts, fun recreation, and memorable Bible stories will help kids know that God is always with them as they ride the rapids of amazing grace.

The children will learn a Bible story a day from the four Gospel books. "We hope that they will have a great time learning the Bible stories. Our hope is that everyone involved will grow closer to God," she said.

VBS is free and is for children ages 3-4 (children must turn three by August 1 and be potty trained); children in kindergarten through fourth grade; and children in fifth and sixth grades. There is also a nursery for children of volunteers who are too young to attend.


