

Adventures Are Awaiting at Our Summer Music & Arts Camps



From music to magic, hundreds of kids will soon have the awesome opportunity to immerse themselves in the arts during the 4th annual Summer Music & Arts Camps, presented by our Adventures in the Arts program. Spots are filling up quickly! The deadline to enroll is July 13. For more information and to download a registration form, visit www.adventuresinthearts.org.

Two camps will be offered this year at PHUMC. Camp I is July 23-27 and Camp II is August 6-10. Both camps are from 8 a.m. – noon and are for children ages 5-14. The cost is \$190 per week.

Eleven exciting classes are offered: I.Q. Music, Discovery Violin, Just Stomp It, Art Sampler, Twisted Sculpture, Nifty Needlework, Yoga, Hip Hop, Masters of Illusion, Discovery Young Chefs, and Pound Rockout.

“The thing that is unique about our camps is that kids can choose four classes from eleven electives. Most camps are designed to teach only one subject, such as cheerleading camp, band camp, basketball camp,” said Jim Maase, Director of Adventures in the Arts and Minister of Music, Arts, and Worship for PHUMC. “The whole idea behind these camps is discovery. We’re trying to help this age group discover the artists inside of them.

The camp staff includes instructors, who are all professionals in their field, as well as aides and volunteers. Jim said that more volunteers are always welcome. “Volunteers can help in any capacity. For instance, in the Discovery Young Chefs class, we will need volunteers to assist as 20 kids are cooking.”

The camp is made possible through funding provided by private individuals, the Cathy and Lou Sanders Music Endowment, PHUMC Foundation, and Adventures in the Arts. Financial aid is available for those who need assistance. For more information, contact Mary Smith at (501) 978-0522.

DISCIPLESHIP ONE OF THE TOPICS OF THIS YEAR'S ANNUAL CONFERENCE


Pathways to Hope was the theme of this year's Annual Conference held in Hot Springs. As many of you may know, Annual Conference is a meeting where clergy and lay members of United Methodist churches in Arkansas gather to worship, hear reports from various groups, committees and Methodist-supported endeavors, and conduct business.

For several years now, we have also been privileged to hear individuals who teach and encourage us to return to our churches with revitalized vigor as Christians. This year, Rev. Junius Dotson, General Secretary and CEO of Discipleship Ministries, spoke about being "intentional disciples," and he provided us with his book, "Developing an Intentional Discipleship System: A Guide for Congregations." He told us discipleship is not optional — IT IS EXPECTED.

Discipleship means engaging the community and BUILDING RELATIONSHIPS. Vital churches have disciples that engage with people and who are connected with people. We must be "GOING" and "GROWING" as disciples if we want to make disciples, who in turn make disciples equipped to transform lives, communities, and the world.

Reading Tutors Needed at Wakefield Elementary


Dear PHUMC,

In September, PHUMC volunteers will meet again for reading tutor orientation at Wakefield Elementary School in southwest Little Rock. Continuing a long history of tutoring at Wakefield, we hope this year to assist 70 children in grades 2-5. The selected students, whose families face significant socioeconomic challenges, read below grade level. Enthusiastic tutors can help them improve their reading and writing skills. Tutors commit to working one to two hours with two to three students individually, and they tutor the same students throughout their years at Wakefield, unless the student moves.

Our motto in recruiting more tutors last year was: "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these."— Mark 10:14. Clearly, helping these students fulfill their academic potential removes significant barriers to their future success and happiness. With thorough support from Wakefield staff, the PHUMC tutors will continue to improve our efforts to help its students achieve their learning goals, truly a joint ministry of loving our neighbors. The blessings flow to both the students and the tutors.

We celebrate and thank those who have volunteered to tutor this year at Wakefield! We also encourage others to join at any time to keep our team strong. Occasionally tutors have personal situations forcing them to withdraw for a year, requiring students to be dropped out unless another tutor can take over the commitment. This is one of those very personal ways in which we can connect with and benefit the children in our public schools. The support of our church is greatly appreciated by the Wakefield teachers and staff. With your help, the 2018-19 year can be the best year yet for tutoring at Wakefield.
