Dear Preschool Parents,

The Preschool Sunday School lesson for Sunday, July 26 focuses on two parables Jesus used to teach his disciples that small acts can lead to big results from Exodus 13:18-8:21. (Main point to take away – God's kingdom is like a mustard seed – small things can have a big effect. Question – What small thing can you do?)

Use the information below to share the story together and do follow up activities with your child(ren). As you share the story, also have a Bible available and show your child(ren) where it is located.

Center yourself for your time together by singing:

Time to Get Together

(Tune: The More We Get Together) It's time to get together, together, together. It's time to get together and listen right now. 'Cause we'll hear a story that's found in the Bible. It's time to get together and listen right now.


Read the Bible story together (Communities Grow):



Communities Grow

The Lord your God is with you wherever you go. (Joshua 1:9)

Read the Bible Story Together: Follow the Suggested Motions



Jesus told two stories about God's love and kingdom. (Hold up two fingers.)

"This is a tiny mustard seed. (Hold up pinkie finger.) It starts out very small. Soon, it grows bigger (Add the ring finger.) and bigger (Add the middle finger.), until it is very tall. (Jump up and stretch your hand up high.)

"This is a tiny bit of yeast. (Hold up pinkie finger.) It starts out very small. Soon, it grows bigger (Add the ring finger.) and bigger (Add the middle finger.), until it is very round. (Make your hands into a big circle.)

"The kingdom of God is just like that. It starts out very small. (Hold up pinkie finger.) Soon, it grows bigger (Add the ring finger.) and bigger (Add the middle finger.), until it is very wide." (Hold arms wide open.)

Our love for God is like that too. It starts out very small. (Hold up pinkie finger.) **Soon, it grows bigger** (Add the ring finger.) **and bigger** (Add the middle finger.), **until it fills us up.** (Hug yourself.)

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Follow-Up Activities:

Discussion:

Say: Jesus used stories, called parables, to teach people things. The story we hear today tells us about God's love and kingdom.

Ask: What did Jesus use to teach his friends what God's kingdom is like? (Mustard seed and yeast) Those things are pretty small but grow to be great things.

Have you ever thought you were too small to do God's work? (Allow child to respond) Jesus wanted his friends to know that no matter how small or how big you are, we are all able to do something that together becomes really big things. We can all do something that helps God's kingdom grow. Can you think of something you can do to help God's kingdom grow? (Allow child to respond)

Paper Craft Activities:

Sing to the tune of "Mulberry Bush."

INSTANT SONG:

- A Tiny Seed Print off the paper craft activity (second to last page). Have your child(ren) draw birds or other animals that might find refuge in the big tree. Tape a small seed (perhaps a mustard seed if you have one) in the roots of the tree. Say: Jesus taught his friends that a small seed would grow to be a big tree. He wanted them to know that the small things they do to help others help God's kingdom grow and grow and grow!
- What Shall I Grow Coloring sheet (See the last page for this color sheet.) Print sheet, find and circle the small seed that grew to be the big tree, and color the picture.

Game Activity:

Say: Let's pretend we are mustard seeds. Do the actions in the rhyme until I say, "Mustard seeds," then you must freeze.

Say: Hop and pop as much as you please (pause), but you must stop when I say, "Mustard seeds!" Twist and turn as much as you please (pause), but you must stop when I say, "Mustard seeds!" Wiggle and jiggle as much as you please (pause), but you must stop when I say, "Mustard seeds!"

Blessing and Prayer Time:

Blessing: Have your child hold out their hand and trace a heart on the back of their hand as you say the following; (You can also use something like lip balm, soap, lotion, etc. to draw a heart on the back of their hand as you say the following blessing.)


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A Tiny Seed
