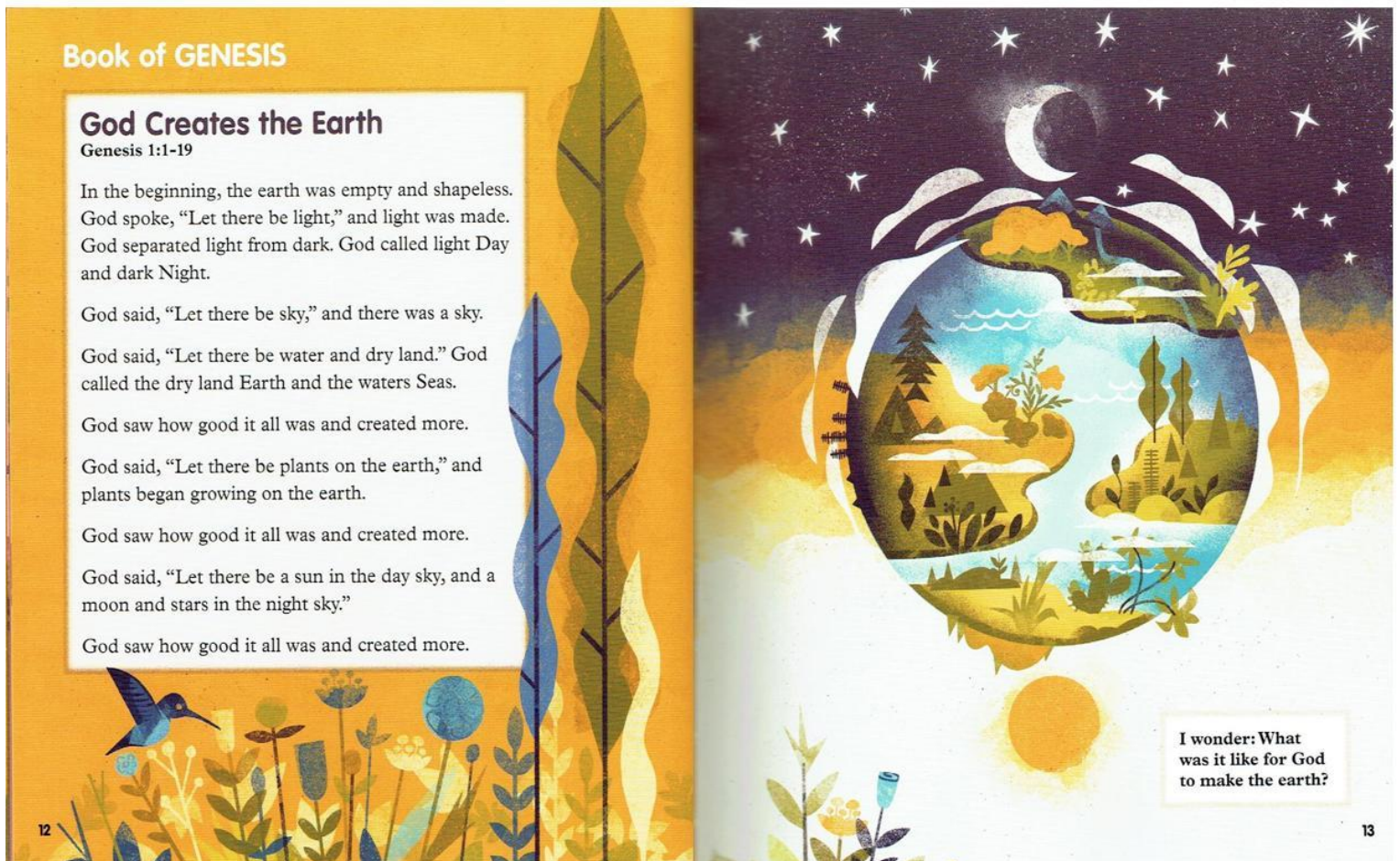
September 6, 2020

Month of September – Creation

Bible Verse: The Lord God made all. (Genesis 2:9)

Bible Story:

Share the story from the picture below, or share a more simplified version below that.



Simplified Story (Based on Genesis chapters 1 & 2):

God made everything. He made the light and the dark, day and night. God made the land and the seas.

Then, he put plants and trees on the land. He set the sun, moon, and stars in the sky. God put birds in the air and fish in the seas. God made every kind of animal that is in the world. Then God made man and woman. Each time God made something new, He said, "It is good."

Questions:

1. Who made the world?
2. What did God say when He created each thing?

Spiritual Practice:

God created the earth round. Have your child look for things that are round. God made them! Thank you God for creating our beautiful earth!

Craft Activity:

Copy the sheet below. Color, or have your child color in, the objects. Cut out the objects on the left side. Share the Simplified Story with your child again and have them add the cut out objects to the picture as you tell the story. Repeat and have them say the things God made. At the end say “It is good!”

Creative Exploration:

Show how God planned for His creation to continue growing. Cut open fruit or veggies and show your child the seeds inside.

If you have some seeds around the house plant them and watch them for signs of growth each week.

Blessing:

Bless your child by touching them and saying “_____ (child’s name) “God made you, God blesses you and care for you. Go now in love.”

Prayer:

Dear God, thank you for making a beautiful world that we can see all around us. Amen.
