

PHUMC Sunday School lessons for Preschool – 5th grade.

September 13, 2020 – God Creates Living Things (Genesis 1:20-25)

Prepare to Wonder

Faith Word: Creativity

The creative Creation story continues. The swarming of the living things is a description of how all creatures inhabit the earth. God divides the animals into three categories – sea animals, sky animals, and land animals. God made a diverse population and demonstrated the importance of all things. God knew that each creature would serve a purpose and be a contributing part of creation. God did not just create one thing; God created many.

God gives a blessing to all living things to reproduce. This is a poetic expression of giving power. It is also important because God sees that all living things are good and God wants to continue creation-bringing forth all of life. There is the continual theme of God calling all of creation good. Diversity of creation is important and good. This is a dynamic of life and blessing. This is the continued creative work of God.

God's creativity has endless possibilities, and there is so much more to come in the marvelous Creation story. God imagined a diverse world where each and every living thing was important. The Creation story shows the goodness of all things, a creative calling of blessing.

All children can also use their imaginations to create. They do this every day through play. Consider the many ways children imagine; begin to see that their imaginations are signs of God's creativity working in the world.

Spiritual Practice for Adults

Imagination is an important part of creativity. What kind of world do you imagine for your children? How does this align with God's imagination for the world? This week, watch or read the news. As you do, notice what words are being used. What kinds of things are shown? Then, use your imagination to compare the world God dreams of to the world in our midst. Ask yourself, what can I do to make this dream of a better world come true? Write down one way you can be an agent of God's creation.

WONDER together

- What is your favorite animal? Why?
- If you could be an animal, what animal would you be?
- If you have pets in your family spend time wondering what they may be thinking about each day.

CONTINUE to Wonder

• How are animals a part of God's creativity?

- Genesis 1:20-25 (Read from your Bible or see below for the Celebrate Wonder version)
- Roll the Wonder Cube. Take time to answer a few of the questions.

Go in Peace


Blessing: Bless your child by touching them and saying "_____ (child's name) "May God bless you and care for you. Go now in love."

Preschool Activity


Supplies: paper plates, creative items from your house (feathers, yarn, construction paper scraps), crayons or markers, glue, hole punch, scissors

Prepare the Paper Plate for them: For each child; cut two circles from the top center of a paper plate for eyeholes. Punch a hole on each side just above the middle of the paper plate to loop yarn through to tie the mask on

Encourage your child(ren) to create a animal mask. Help the children put the masks on and pretend to be the living creature they created!

WONDER: God created places for all the living things to live. Where does the creature you created live?









Early Elementary Activity Nature Walk

Supplies: Clipboards, paper, pens or pencils, brown paper bags, gloves (optional). Go outside and observe God's creation.

Say: I want you to notice all that God has created. What do you see? What do you notice?

- Pick up three items that represent the beauty of God's creation and put them in the bag. Remember to be respectful of the earth.
- After you finish with your collection, go back inside and sit down with someone in your family and share what you have collected. Talk about how these items show us the beauty of God's creation. Everything on the earth is beautiful and good.

WONDER: How did God create the earth?




Older Elementary Activity Imagine Animals (Art)

Supplies: paper, crayons, markers, colored pencils

Say: In the Bible story, God created all kinds of animals. In order to do this, God had to imagine them. Let's imagine and draw our own beautiful animals.

Give your child art supplies to draw a made-up animal from his or her imagination. Have your child share and tell you about the drawing. Encourage them to be creative! (Some fun examples below.)
