Month of November our Faith word is Blessing


Bible Verse: I am with you now, I will protect you everywhere you

Bible Story:

Questions:

- 1. Jacob tricked Esau into giving his birthright up for a bowl of soup. Is it the right choice or a wrong choice to trick someone? (Wrong)
- 2. Who can help us make right choices? (God can. We can pray to God and ask Him to help us make good choices.)

Spiritual Practice:

Help your child this week when making choices by leading them through the following prayer. "God, help me choose wisely." Remind your child that he or she can say this prayer out loud, or silently, when they are trying to make a decision. Practice doing this yourself in front of your child so they know you seek God's help in making good choices.

Craft Activity:

Copy the sheet below and give to your child to color. Ask them to point out Jacob and Esau. Ask them if either of the brothers made good choices in our story.

Blessing:

Bless your child by touching them and saying "You are a blessing from God. Thank you, God, for _____ (child's name)."

Prayer:

Thank you, God for all our many blessings. We love you. Amen.
