

PHUMC Sunday School lessons for Preschool – 5th grade. December 13, 2020 – Joseph's Joy (Matthew 1:18-24) Prepare to Wonder Faith Word: Joy

The faith word this month is joy, a feeling of gratitude and happiness. Joy will often lead to celebration. Mary sang a beautiful song of joy when she knew she was doing what God had asked her to do. Joseph, on the other hand, was probably not overcome with joy. He was most likely torn between his feelings for Mary and the trouble he knew she would be in when it was discovered she was with child and not married.

The struggle was real. I imagine Joseph spent many sleepless nights not knowing what to do. During one of those sleepless nights, God sent an angel, Gabriel, to Joseph in a dream. Gabriel told Joseph the baby Mary carried was a gift from God to the world. Gabriel told Joseph, "You will call him Jesus... Emmanuel. (Emmanuel means 'God with us')" (Matthew 1:21, 23)

By naming Jesus, Joseph was officially accepting Jesus as his son, according to the laws in the ancient Mediterranean world. Joseph not only accepted Jesus as his son, he willingly raised and cared for Jesus. Joseph listened and did as God asked and, because he obeyed, he was filled with joy of having a son and celebrating with Mary at the birth of Jesus.

Advent is a time of joyful anticipation as we wait for the celebration of the birth of Jesus on Christmas Day. Joseph's days may have been filled with joyful anticipation as he, too awaited the birth of Jesus.

& 7). On pg. 7 you will find the suggested Spiritual Practice activity for the week. JOY sometimes comes from acceptance. Joseph accepted the words of the angel from God. He took Mary as his wife and raised Jesus as his son.

As you light your Advent wreath this week, read Matthew 1:18-24.

¹⁸ This is how the birth of Jesus the Messiah came about. His mother Mary and Joseph had promised to get married. But before they started to live together, it became clear that she was going to have a baby. She became pregnant by the power of the Holy Spirit. ¹⁹ Her husband Joseph was faithful to the law. But he did not want to put her to shame in public. So he planned to divorce her quietly.

²⁰ But as Joseph was thinking about this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream. The angel said, "Joseph, son of David, don't be afraid to take Mary home as your wife. The baby inside her is from the Holy Spirit. ²¹ She is going to have a son. You must give him the name Jesus. That's because he will save his people from their sins."

²² All this took place to bring about what the Lord had said would happen. He had said through the prophet, ²³ "The virgin is going to have a baby. She will give birth to a son. And he will be called Immanuel." (Isaiah 7:14) The name Immanuel means "God with us."

²⁴ Joseph woke up. He did what the angel of the Lord commanded him to do. He took Mary home as his wife.

Sing your favorite carols or songs, and dance in celebration of the coming birth of Jesus.

Sing songs of joy and praise as you gather as a family this week.


Blessing: Bless your child by touching them and saying "Joy to the world! Let joy fill your heart!


Joseph's Joy Matthew 1:18-24

Preschool Activity Joyful Colors (Game)

Supplies: Beach towel or a small sheet, different colored bows of various sizes

Say: Bows usually mean presents and presents usually mean gifts, and gifts usually bring joy. Let's shake the cloth and see how long we can keep all the bows on the cloth.

- After a little bit, stop shaking the cloth and lay it down. Have everyone pick up a bow. Take turns sharing why each chose the color bow they did. Does that color bring them joy?
- Return to playing "parachute" with the bows as the interest remains.

WONDER: Sometimes we celebrate special times with gifts. The angel told Joseph that Jesus was a gift from God for everyone. How do you think Joseph celebrated the good news that Jesus was a gift from God?

Sent from heaven long ago. (Point to heaven)


Early Elementary Activity God is with Us Card (Art)
