Collaborative Ministry Supports the Men's Prison and Community Homeless Agencies

For more than 20 years PHUMC has provided Christmas socks and meals for the local community men's prison center and Christmas gift bags for the Little Rock Compassion Center, through our Good Samaritan Fund. Your gifts have made a difference in the lives of those in prison and the homeless in Pulaski County.

During the 2020 holiday season, however, PHUMC members joined together to make Christmas brighter for hundreds of men, women and children in these local homeless-support agencies and the Men's Prison Center.

Our first annual **Socktoberfest** resulted in over 1,000 pair of socks being donated by our faithful members. For the Community Men's Prison Center, all 130 pair had to be the same since they do not separate the laundry for these men. As we were led individually in our



purchases, it was soon apparent that MIRACLES do happen and we were able to provide 130 pair of identical socks to them. PHUMC also provides a holiday meal each year.

Christmas gift bags for the Compassion Center included a pair of new socks, hat and gloves, a variety of toiletries, a poncho and washcloth for 427 persons who use this important service. An additional 200 pairs of socks and toiletries including hand soap from the Guatemala Mission Teams were donated to be used throughout the year. The Compassion Center provides beds for 40 women and 200 men nightly. They are opening a new education center for women and children nearby.

Thanks go to members of the James B. Argue, Sr. Sunday School class for 'un-packaging' the bulk items, sorting and counting socks, and then preparing the holiday gift bags for the Compassion Center. Other church members and our great custodial staff 'bagged the bags' and loaded them up for delivery.

PHUMC also provided 200 pair of socks, toiletries and soap to the Jericho Way Day Resource Center on Springer Blvd. We have been a partner with this agency for several years and provided, with the help of the Koinonia Dialogue Class members, the Thanksgiving meal this year. Jericho Way has been the recipient of special offerings from PHUMC as well as the Community Easter Sunrise Service.

PHUMC also provides a monthly Good Samaritan stipend to help support those referred to the Compassion Center, Jericho Way and the St. Francis House through our Caring Ministry.

We say thank you, Church, for your faithfulness in caring for our neighbors in need through your monetary gifts, **SOCKTOBERFEST** donations and prayers. "It takes a Village" and we are part of a GREAT one here at PHUMC.
