Karen and I recently had the opportunity to see the newly released Richard Linklater film *Boyhood* starring Patricia Arquette, Ethan Hawke and Ellar Coltrane. Filmed intermittently over a twelve year period, *Boyhood* tracks the life of fictional character Mason Evans, Jr. (Coltrane) from the time he is six-years old through his matriculation to college at age eighteen.




