



They met as young people at Winfield UMC at a United Methodist Youth district meeting and were active members of Oak Forest UMC until joining PHUMC. Don's life revolved around his family, church, school, and Boy Scouts. At PHUMC he was active with the Board of Stewards, Dietz Dialogue Class, and Helping Hands. He was also a PHUMC "office angel" – helping to stuff envelopes or whatever else was needed.



Dorothy said that Don took out these particular insurance policies to protect the family when they had young children. In later years he wanted to give something special to the church and he and Dorothy decided to make the church the beneficiary on both policies. Dorothy and children, Donna Morey and Rev. Mike Morey, have requested that Don's estate gift of \$7,401.43 go to the Cokenour Endowment, an endowment of the Foundation. Income from the Cokenour Endowment is used for college scholarships for those who wish to enter the ministry or another church-related profession. The Foundation is grateful for that important decision which will make an impact in countless lives in perpetuity.




