200,000 children go hungry in AR. That is 1 in every 4 kids. In response, the AR United Methodist Church is seeking to reduce hunger with a targeted, comprehensive initiative, of which PHUMC is a part.

This semester we at SNL hope to do good as we eat well. In order to raise awareness of the plight of the 200,000 hungry children in AR, we will serve meals eaten by many of the world's poor—rice and beans, white chili, beans and cornbread, and baked potatoes. Cost is \$5/adult and \$3/child with a \$20 maximum for a family. No reservations ö are needed.

All 2015 contributions must be received by December 31. If contributions are mailed, they must be postmarked by December 31 to be eligible for 2015 tax purposes. You can also drop off contributions at the Welcome Center during business hours or place your contribution in the outside mail slot on the handicapped access pole (facing the building) at Entrance 1 anytime.

If you are 70½ or older, you may transfer up to \$100,000 this year from your IRA to PHUMC. Your gift will not be subject to federal income tax and will qualify for your required minimum distribution (RMD). 
