She has assisted with baptisms, prayed at hospital bedsides and counseled with us during difficult times. Under Lynn's leadership our Foundation has grown to a remarkable \$7.5 million today. Lynn's ministry has touched virtually every person and every area of our church and we are eternally grateful.



At the end of this month, Lynn will retire as a member of our church staff. She and Wayne will have more time to spend with their beautiful family, and they will be able to catch up on a million and one things they've wanted to do for some time now. Of course, the tremendous blessing for all of us is that Lynn and Wayne will remain active and vital members of our church family.


I know you will want to join with me on January 31 as together we proclaim to Rev. Lynn Lindsey, "Well done, good and faithful servant!"
