



# ON BEING THE CHURCH IN THE 21ST CENTURY

Last week I received a letter from a Sunday morning TV viewer who mused about the sweeping changes taking place in the church today. After expressing concern about some of the pronouncements that are being espoused by various Christian groups, the viewer wrote: "I appreciate you and the PH staff and congregation for facing those head-on and yet seemingly striking a balance between the old and the new, the liberal and the conservative theologically."

"Doing church" is a challenging task today. The church of my childhood (late 1950's-60's) was relatively simple. Offer a Sunday morning worship service, an occasional potluck supper, Sunday evening youth group and an annual Vacation Bible School, and the church was content. Because we lived in a "church culture" during the later part of the 20th century, little else was required. It's much more complex today. In 2016, people are pulled in a million different directions by a million different gods, so it's important to share the good news of the one true God—the God of Abraham, Isaac, Jacob and Jesus Christ—in an authentic and meaningful way.







On the other hand, dynamic growing churches are outward focused. These churches have a passion for sharing Christ with the world through word and deed. This, of course, is a major reason for PHUMC's continued upward

trajectory. We have a passion for loving God and loving neighbor that leads us to change the world that God so loved...

Pray that we might continue to move beyond our walls. Pray that, through our myriad missions and ministries, we will continue to facilitate transformation as we love and respond to others in the name of Christ. Pray that our God-sized dreams for our new St. Luke campus will become a God-sized reality!
