

# **Electronic Giving**

The cool weather of fall is just around the corner - my favorite time of year, but it's also a sign that the usually stressful 4th quarter here in the Finance Office is fast approaching. As you may know, historically around 20% of our annual contributions to the Operating Budget are received in the month of December alone and around 37% are received in the 4th quarter. This compares to an average of 21% of our contributions received in each of the 1st three guarters of the year - roughly equal to the amount received in the month of December alone (see graph).

But unfortunately expenses remain fairly consistent each quarter. In addition, this year we have begun implementing the new apportionment payment methodology based on the scriptural 10% tithe, by paying each month 10% of the actual prior month's contributions to meet our annual apportionments goal. Apportionments allow PHUMC, together with other United Methodist Churches through our connected congregations, to accomplish what no single church, district, or Annual Conference ever could hope to do alone. Consistent expense levels over the year and the new apportionment payment method only magnify the importance of 4th quarter giving. But you can help take some of the pressure off of meeting our 4th quarter contribution goal.



**Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT)** is a simple way to help, with no cost to the church. Using **EFT** giving will ensure that you meet your contribution goal with a consistent giving level throughout the year. To participate, all you need to do is contact the Finance Office at phumcfinance@phumc.com. You will need to provide your bank account and routing number, the amount you wish to contribute each month and the date of the EFT withdrawal – either the 1st day or the 15<sup>th</sup> day of the month. You can also sign up for **EFT** giving at phumc.com/give. If you choose to give via EFT, there are cards conveniently placed in the worship areas for you to place in the collection plate during each worship service.

Once you've signed up, no other action is necessary. And you've helped take a little stress off the Finance Office by providing a consistent giving level throughout the year, thereby reducing our dependency on 4th quarter giving – particularly in the month of December.
