In 2005, the Pulaski Heights United Methodist Church Foundation Board established the Willing Friends Society for persons who made the simple, but significant, decision to remember the church in their wills. The Society began with 81 members. Today, there are 300 Willing Friends including 46 who have joined the Church Triumphant and six anonymous friends.

Becoming a Willing Friend simply requires an acknowledgment of intention to support the church during your lifetime **and** beyond. We do not ask for a copy of your will or estate plan or any other documentation nor do we ask for the expected gift amount, though we do accept whatever information is offered. These gifts can be made in a variety of ways: bequests, trusts, stocks or other investments, life insurance, retirement funds or gift annuities, to name a few. All gifts are welcome and will add to the future financial security of PHUMC.

When the Willing Friends Society began, I wanted my family to be a part of it even though Buddy and I had not updated our wills to include a gift to the church. When his mother, Hazel, passed away the following year, we requested memorials be made to the PHUMC Foundation with a long-term goal of establishing the Villines Family Endowment. While that hasn't become a reality at this time, we have since taken the steps to formalize our commitment for the future with a life insurance policy which is owned by the Foundation and for which we remit the annual premium to the Foundation.

Jim Argue, President and CEO of the United Methodist Foundation of Arkansas and a fellow Willing Friend and I are happy to meet with members to guide them in selecting the best option that meets your family's needs. We will honor and celebrate our Willing Friends at our annual luncheon Sunday, October 2. 
