FAMILY PROMISE

January 28 - February 4

Family Promise is a program that provides housing, meals, transportation, support, and love for families who are temporarily without jobs and housing and have children. Four times each year, Pulaski Heights United Methodist Church hosts Family Promise for a week by providing housing, meals, and activities. During the day, women and men are seeking employment or working at a job. Children are in school or day care. In the evening, they arrive at the church and a room is provided for each family. Meals are provided, showers are available, children can play, students can study and their lives go on, as church members assist this plan with volunteers cooking meals, staying overnight and providing hosts from 5-6 pm each day and 12-hour coverage overnight. Saturdays require volunteers to be with the families all day. Families come to our church on Sunday afternoon and stay until 7 am the following Sunday. Thanks to our Youth Ministry for sharing their facilities with this program.


