Becoming John Marin: Modernist at Work introduces the AAC's important new collection of works by John Marin (1870-1953), given by the artist's daughter-in-law, Norma Marin Modernist at Work will bring the viewer inside the artistic process of one of America's outstanding modern artists. Marin is best known for his luminous watercolors of rural Maine and urban New York. This exhibition invites viewers to look over the artist's shoulder as he created and honed the private sketches he would interpret into completed watercolors and etchings. The show follows the evolution of Marin's style and methods as he transformed from intuitive draftsman to innovative modernist watercolorist and etcher.



Synopsis - Perhaps the greatest question for many people, especially the young, is "what should I do with my life?" For many Christians, this question is often changed to "what is God calling me to do?" or "What is God's will for me?" However, is this the question that we really need to ask? Perhaps a better question is, "What is God calling us to be?"

Calling is often wrapped up in the word "vocation." This word has, at times, meant "Christian vocation" or "ministry," but the word itself, from the Latin vocare meaning "to call," simply means a calling to become what we are meant to become. When we become more of who we are, then our actions will be manifested from our transformation. In other words, doing will follow becoming.


