In *Rogue One*, the "realists" among the rebels have forgotten the purpose of their fight: to stand against evil. They believe the Death Star has such power that it is futile to resist the evil Empire. But hero Jen Erso reminds them: "Rebellions are built on hope." So is the Gospel. What evil must we resist? What instances in history have shown us that resisting evil is powerful, and hope is real? What is our armor and how can we use it to fight evil around us?

God's Upside Down World

A scrawny, nerdy teen Viking named Hiccup is a disappointment to his father, Stoic, the chief of their tribe. Hiccup hasn't yet killed the tribe's greatest enemy, dragons, which is a rite of passage. When Hiccup downs a killer Night Fury, wounds it, and then befriends it, Hiccup realizes that dragons are not the enemy. Hiccup must stand up to his father, his tribe, and go against the wisdom of the world: that only strength and might win.

2 Timothy 1:1-7

Rootless

Coco tells the story of Miguel, who loves music. However, his family has forbidden music for generations because of a long ago tragedy. Miguel is able to bring the world of the living and the dead together when he accidentally stumbles into the afterlife on Dia Del Muertos. While not orthodox, the movie has themes about remembering the saints, and why—as we in the church teach—2,000 years of tradition is important to our identity. For us, tradition reminds us we are God's children, and nothing can separate us from the love of God, not even death.
