As one of the wealthiest nations on the planet, the United States has a significantly larger percentage of citizens who are financially privileged than do most other countries. We are not hesitant about amassing ginormous quantities of money and material possessions for our own consumption. This, of course, is a mindset that differentiates us from cultures that are forced to focus on simply surviving. Unlike our less prosperous neighbors, "making it big" and "having it all" are part and parcel of the American Dream. There is even an insidious brand of American Christianity known as "prosperity religion" that asserts wealth is a sign of God's blessing on our lives.

The Bible speaks of a different kind of blessing—blessing that comes from caring and sharing and being in relationship with God and neighbor. When I left my former occupation to enter fulltime ordained ministry 35 years ago, I was making an annual salary of \$70,000—not bad in 1983. However, after three years spent earning a masters' degree at Duke University, I returned to Arkansas with my spouse and three children to serve a church in south Arkansas at an annual salary of \$19,000! It didn't take long for me to realize that wealth in God's kingdom has less to do with the number of bills in my wallet and more to do with being content in God's presence.

The summer months are challenging for churches everywhere, at least in terms of finances. Summer vacations pull us in a million different directions. The offering plate can take on an anemic appearance this time of year. Your support is desperately needed. I have no qualms about asking you for money. After all, I'm not asking for myself—I'm asking for God. I'm also not a prosperity preacher. I refuse to lie to you by telling you every dollar you give will be returned ten-fold. However, I do promise you that the non-material blessings you receive will be unparalleled!
