Ministry Spotlight: Helping Hands

Rise in the presence of the aged, show respect for the elderly, and revere your God. -Leviticus 19:32

Without a doubt, the comprehensive Caring Ministries at PHUMC change lives, both to the people being served and to the volunteers who serve them.

One of those ministries is the Helping Hands Respite Care Center. This program provides care for senior adults with disabilities every Tuesday from 9:30 a.m.-2:30 p.m. in Wesley Hall. Seniors who are receiving home care are eligible. The cost is \$20 a day.

Clients have constant supervision under trained, devoted volunteers and at least one registered nurse. A nutritious meal is served at lunch time. The day's activities include low-impact exercises, visits with therapy dogs, singing, a short devotional, old time TV shows and movies, musical entertainment, and Christian fellowship.



The program was started in August of 1996 by the late Cecil Malone to provide a safe place for seniors so their family caregivers could have a much needed break.

"If you have been a family caregiver, you know the importance of taking care of yourself, and the few hours offered on Tuesdays can make a huge difference in your week," said Bev Villines, Director of PHUMC Foundation and Senior Adults. "We are grateful for the privilege of spending the day with these loved ones – folks we might not have gotten to to know otherwise."

Bev said there are currently 10-12 regular attendees and often that many volunteers. "We are always hoping to have more of our members and friends join us in service to our family caregivers," she said. "As a volunteer, all you need is a big heart, the gift of gab, and compassion for our many family caregivers who need a little time for themselves." Please consider placing flowers in honor or memory of a loved one in the Columbarium Garden.



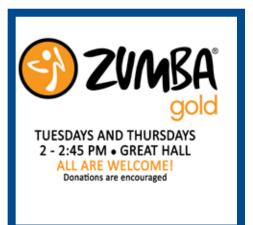
