In January 2018, we opened our doors of the St. Luke Learning Center to families in the Broadmoor neighborhood. We are at capacity with a waiting list, and we are serving the families we intended to target: working parents at or below the poverty level.

Our start-up costs and lead time for some government reimbursements has been higher and taken longer than we originally predicted. Because of shortfalls in other areas of the budget, the PHUMC budget cannot cover this. WE NEED YOUR HELP!

We are projected to be \$200,000 short by the end of the year. (40 kids enrolled x \$5,000 shortfall per kid) We are looking for sponsorships. We need sponsorships for 40 KIDS in 40 DAYS.

UPDATE FROM THE FINANCE COMMITTEE

In an effort to be good stewards of the funds entrusted to PHUMC, and an attempt to move toward a balanced operating budget for 2019, the Finance Committee has recently voted to eliminate certain expenses from the budget. **First, donuts will no longer be available on Sunday mornings.** The last Sunday for donuts will be June 2. **The trolley service will also be discontinued.** The last Sunday to ride the trolley will be June 9.

In addition to these expenditures, moving the Tower Newsletter to bi-weekly has already reduced our communications line item. These changes could be temporary or possibly have adjustments in the future. The Committee will continue to reduce expenses as necessary in order to bring the budget in line for 2019. The Finance Committee has also engaged Horizons Stewardship Company under a coaching agreement for the next year, to implement an overall generosity growth strategy for PHUMC. The first step was the creation of a Generosity Team, which began their work earlier this month to implement the recommendations from the Horizons Stewardship Discovery report.
