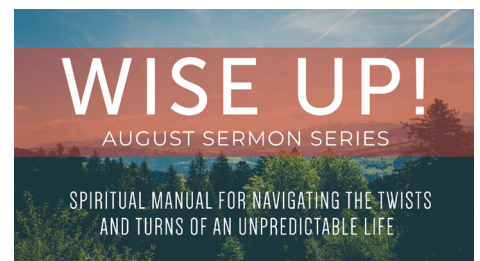

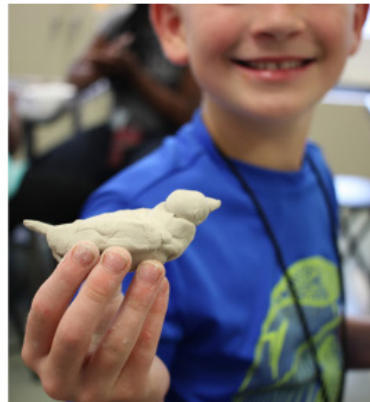
Does the Bible Say That?

BE A WAKEFIELD TUTOR!

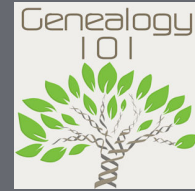
