My Very Own PHUMC 2019 Recap

This year has been my first full year as Director of Communications and also as a member of PHUMC. It has been incredible to see the full scope of the ministries of our great church. From our worship and broadcast ministries, to our caring and outreach ministries, PHUMC continues to shine bright in this community.

I got to experience amazing services: the Raney Lecture Series, the Easter Sunrise Service (my first), Confirmation Sunday and just last week, a packed house at the family service on Christmas Eve!

That's a big part of why I love being here. I love witnessing and sharing good stories and this place is full of them! So I figured with 2019 ending and a new year beginning, I would recap some of my favorite and biggest stories from my first year.



PHUMC Diaper Bank Takes Off - While the idea of the diaper bank started in 2018 with a church wide diaper drive, the PHUMC Diaper Bank launched this year. The first few months we gave out about 4,500 diapers to roughly 50 families. Then in December the Diaper Bank took off handing out 3,000 diapers to 33 families and 47 kids! One mother interviewed in a recent story on KATV said "I feel like a lot is lifted off my shoulders just by them donating diapers to us," said single mom of five, Erica Alcala. "I would hope one day I can repay them back somehow."

Pet Ministry Expansion – In November PHUMC launched a full pet ministry expansion that finds ways to incorporate pets fully into the lives of the church community. In addition to therapy dog training, PHUMC is offering Care and Support for Pet Owners, Community Service and Educational Programs, and Animal Events. We've already handed out pet prayer blankets to those in need and expanded our popular Therapy Dog training sessions into Spring, Summer and Fall!





Remembering Bishop Kenneth Hicks and Elaine Hicks – This year we lost a beloved couple in our church family. Sadly, I never had the chance to meet them but I was grateful to hear all the amazing stories shared during their memorial service. Every day I take the opportunity to walk through Bishop Hicks Peace Garden to pick up my son from CLC. As Rev. Britt Skarda shared, there is no denying the "legacy Elaine and Ken left us—a legacy that has made us better, stronger and more faithful followers of Jesus Christ." "Blessed are those who die in the Lord; they will rest from their labors, for their deeds follow them." Revelation 14:13.

Rev. Britt Skarda Retirement Announcement - Rev. Skarda announced his plans to retire at the end of this conference year, June 30, 2020. We are grateful for all of the wonderful years of service Britt has had at Pulaski Heights United Methodist Church and look forward to celebrating his well-deserved retirement. His history with our church dates back thirty years, first as an associate pastor and more recently as senior pastor since 2010. It truly has been a pleasure listening to his sermons this year!





World Cheese Dip Championship – After the canceling of our own Mac-n-cheese festival, Rev. Betsy and I were determined to find something cheesy to get involved in. We had no idea though just how much cheese it would be. This year we entered the World Cheese Dip Championship benefitting the Harmony Health Clinic. We handed out over 16 gallons of cheese dip and ended up taking home first place! We will definitely be back next year!!

Medical Missions - Both our Honduras and Guatemala Medical Missions helped hundreds in need. But there was one particular story that stuck out that we shared on Facebook. One man came to our Guatemala clinic as a blind man. After two surgeries with Dr. Chacko, by the end of the week he could see! Amazing job by all those who served in our global missions this year.





VBS - I grew up helping my mom and grandma run Vacation Bible School at Lakewood UMC in North Little Rock. It is always a highlight to see the faces of children discovering the wonders of God's Universe and at PHUMC, 450 kids got to experience just that. Furthermore, the children helped raise funds and supplies for our friends at Ozark Mission Project and our 56 team worked at different missions throughout the week. There is no charge for VBS, and this can only happen because our church family loves and supports our precious children in every way possible.

Arkansas Annual Conference - The 2019 Annual Conference for the Arkansas United Methodist Church celebrated the ordination of former PHUMC Associate Youth Minister and member Katye Dunn Chambers as a Deacon for the UMC. We were also excited that the selection of 20 delegates for the 2020 General Conference included 4 who have a connection to PHUMC: Karon Mann, Miller Wilbourn, Sarah Argue and Jessie Waddell Teegarden.
