Dear Infant/Toddler Parents,

This Infant/Toddler Sunday School curriculum for Sunday, May 3. This month we start our focus on Pentecost! Use the information below to share the story together and do follow-up activities with your child(ren). As you share the story, also have a Bible available to show the children where it is located.

(May's Bible Story is located in Acts 2:1-41)

(May's Bible Verse is Acts 2:4: They were all filled with the Holy Spirit.)

Center yourself for your time together by singing:

You may want to start your time together by centering yourselves with a song. The song for today is called "Pentecost"

(It is song to the tune of "She'll Be Coming 'Round the Mountain")

Oh, they were all together in one place. (Hold up 1 finger)


Oh, they were all together in one place. (Hold up 1 finger)

Read the Bible story together





Follow-Up Activities:

Look at the Bible story card together. Pretend to be the people in the picture. Look surprised and wiggle your fingers above your head like the flames of the Holy Spirit.

Paper Craft Activity:

- Color the P with Red color crayon. (See the end of the lesson material.)
- The letter P is the first letter of the word Pentecost. Pentecost is the Birthday of the church. It reminds us that God sent the Holy Spirit to always be with us. Let's sing Happy Birthday to the church while you color the letter P.

Movement Activity:

 Make a Ribbon Dancer stick — 3 strips of red ribbon (each about 2-feet long) stacked together and then taped to a craft stick. Play children's Christian music and have a dance party. God's Holy Spirit is with us and helps us move like the wind!


Game Activity:

• Play "I Spy" something red. Encourage your child(ren) to look around and find all things that are red. The Red reminds us of Pentecost & the flames of fire that appeared above the heads of Jesus' friends to let them know they are not alone.

• Bubble Prayer:



Try this as a family. Get a bottle of bubbles and gather your family outside. Explain that you are going to pray with bubbles. You each take a turn by saying a prayer out loud and then blow bubbles to the sky. You can help your child see their bubbles floating up to God.





• Make a Red Meal/Snack together:



• Pray for the Church and sing Happy Birthday (at bedtime or any time):

Blessing: Have your child out their hand and trace a cross on the back of their hand as you say the following; (You can also use something like lip balm, soap, lotion, etc. to draw a cross on the back of their hand as you say the following blessing.)


Say: _____, God loves you. God blesses you. God is always with you.
