Pulaski Heights United Methodist Church Preschool Sunday School Material for July 19, 2020

Dear Preschool Parents,

The Preschool Sunday School lesson for Sunday, July 19 focuses on the story of Samuel and the Israelites from 1 Samuel 7:15-8:22. (Main point to take away – God's people grew and changed when God chose Saul to be king. Question – What does God ask you to do?)

Use the information below to share the story together and do follow up activities with your child(ren). As you share the story, also have a Bible available and show your child(ren) where it is located.

Center yourself for your time together by singing:

Time to Get Together

(Tune: The More We Get Together) It's time to get together, together, together. It's time to get together and listen right now. 'Cause we'll hear a story that's found in the Bible. It's time to get together and listen right now.

Read the Bible story together (Communities Transition):



Communities Transition The LORD your God is with you wherever you go.

(Joshua 1:9)

Read the Bible Story Together: Follow the Suggested Motions





Samuel was a judge. He helped the people of Israel know how to love and serve God. One day the people came to Samuel. (We want a king! We want a king!)

"God is your leader," said Samuel. "You don't need a king." (We want a king! We want a king!)

"All the other countries have a king. We want to be like them," said the people. (We want a king! We want a king!)

So, Samuel told God the people wanted a king. (We want a king! We want a king!)

God told Samuel to choose a young man named Saul as the first king of Israel. (We want a king! We want a king!)

All the people came to see the new king, but they couldn't find him. (We want a king! We want a king!)

The people found Saul hiding behind big baskets and jars. (We want a king! We want a king!)

"God has chosen Saul to be your first king," said Samuel. (We have a king! We have a king!)

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Follow-Up Activities: Discussion:

Say: Saul hid himself when the all the people came to see him because he was afraid.

Ask: Have you ever been asked to do something you didn't want to do? How did you feel when you were asked? Were you scared or pleased to be asked?

Say: When we are asked to do something we do not think we can do, or we are scared to do, all we have to remember is that God is with us wherever we go and He will help us, like He helped Saul, and others who are faithful to Him.

Finger Plays & Action Rhymes:

<u>God Helps</u> (Finger Play Option)
 <u>God</u> (point upwards)
 <u>helps</u> (act like you're helping someone off the floor)
 <u>those who trust</u> (fold hands together)
 <u>in Him</u> (point upwards.)

• God's Direction Rhyme (Action Rhyme Option)

As you teach the children this active rhyme, remind them that God loves us and wants the best for us. That's why we do what God wants.

North (Point up.), South (Point down.), East (Point to the children's right.), West (Point to the children's left.), The ways of the Lord are always best. (Point straight forward with both hands.) He guides me in my walk each day. (Make a walking motion with your hands.) Following him is the only way! (Point straight up.)

The Golden Rule

(Tune: The Muffin Many) Do you know the Golden Rule? Golden Rule, Golden Rule? Do you know the Golden Rule? that Jesus taught his friends.

Who is with you (Hold hands out to sides like you are asking a question?) when you are hurt or in danger? (Point to self.) God! (Point up to heaven.)

Who is with you (Hold hands out to sides like you are asking a question?) when you are lost or alone? (Point to sad face.) God! (Point up to heaven.)

I know (Point to self) in my heart (Make a heart shape with hands.)
God will care. (Point up to heaven.)
I know (Point to self) in my heart (Make a heart shape with hands.)
God is there. (Spread your arms wide.)

Paper Craft Activities:

- Where Is Saul? Print off the paper craft activity (second to last page). Have your child(ren) find Saul, the crown and the jar in the crowd below Say: God chose Saul to be the king of Israel. Saul may have been surprised that God chose him, which is way he was hiding.
- **Bible Story coloring sheet** (See the last page for this color sheet.) Print sheet, color and find Saul.

Snack Activity:

When you and your child(ren) have a snack together, pretend you are at a grand banquet, or party, for the new king. Remind your child(ren) that the Israelite people were very happy when Samuel told them Saul would be their king. What foods do you think they would serve a king?

Blessing and Prayer Time:

Blessing: Have your child hold out their hand and trace a heart on the back of their hand as you say the following; (You can also use something like lip balm, soap, lotion, etc. to draw a heart on the back of their hand as you say the following blessing.) Say: (child's name), **God will always be with you.**

Prayer: (It might be something like) Dear God, help me be a good leader and follow you. Amen.

Travel Time


Be Together: Visit the library and check out books on kings and queens.

- B. Or you can donate diapers to the church for our monthly diaper drive.




