

Midyouth Work To Help The Homeless

Last month, 21 of our PHMidyouth (6th-8th grade) came together and created Care Bags for our neighbors living on the street. They created 500 bags for our members to keep in their cars and pass out to people who are seeking assistance. These care bags include: wet wipes, peanuts, bottled water, peppermints, and more food.

Not only did our MidYouth create these bags, they also donated \$334 to help pay for these materials; including one girl who saved \$125 of her own allowance. We are very proud of these kids and the giving spirit that they have.



It costs approximately \$1,500 to buy the materials for 500 care
