Tania Kelley, senior at Little Rock Central High School and Adventures in the Arts voice student, has been selected to receive the Stanley and Arminta Berry Music and Arts scholarship for the coming school year. She is a member of Mt. Nebo A.M.E. Church and has sung here at PHUMC on a number of occasions including the service at War Memorial Stadium on Easter Sunday.

Tania is a member of the LR Central Concert Choir and the Madrigals as well as singing with the LR Central Jazz Band. She will be studying vocal performance at the University of Central Arkansas in Conway. Her faculty sponsors attest to her incredible talent, her dedication to music and her continuous learning ethic. She says 'singing allows me to express myself and help others sometimes do the same'.

Alex Shannon has also been selected to receive the Stanley and Arminta Music and Arts Scholarship! He will begin his doctoral program in Music Theory in the fall at Indiana University. TUTORS WANTED TO HELP READ TO CHILDREN AT WAKEFIELD ELEMENTARY!



In May 2019, forty-three PHUMC Wakefield tutors and eighty-six students celebrated the end of the school year with a pizza party in Wesley Hall, because for the first time, there wasn't enough room at the school. Everyone had a great time, and one of my students loved the celebration so much that she asked me several

she asked me several times if she would get to come to PHUMC for pizza again. By September 2019, PHUMC tutors started the new school year with anticipation of another celebration in May 2020. As we all know, the COVID-19 pandemic abruptly ended the in-person school year in March, we stopped tutoring and were not able to celebrate at the end of the year.

Wakefield's principal, Les Taylor, recently reported that in spite of everything, the 2020-2021 school year has been amazing. 60% of students currently attending school in person have maintained their reading levels. Principal Taylor has asked us to resume our tutoring program in the fall, which benefits all students needing reading practice; he noted that students attending virtually have fallen further behind and really need the additional help our tutoring provides.

We always need new tutors, because, invariably, tutors have conflicts and need to be replaced, whether for a few weeks or several months. Having enough tutors allows us to work on reading comprehension with the maximum number of Wakefield children. PHUMC tutors represent a variety of ages, from retirees to young parents to single people who take time from their jobs to read with these underserved students. Tutors schedule their preferred day and time to volunteer.

Now is the time to join our team to read with a child or two or three, weekly, throughout the next year. We expand on the PHUMC mission statement, "Love God, Love Neighbor, Change the World" with our motto in recruiting tutors: "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these"— Mark 10:14. Helping students meet their academic potential through improved reading will affect their future success and happiness, thus changing the world! Tutoring is a rewarding experience for tutors, as well as students and teachers, who greatly appreciate all PHUMC provides. Through the food pantry, backpacks, Christmas gifts and tutoring, PHUMC has a strong relationship with Wakefield Elementary School.
