WORSHIP UPDATE

Dear Congregation,

As we are all too aware, vaccination rates are low and Covid infection rates are dramatically increasing daily. Consequently, we are immediately implementing the following requirements at Pulaski Heights United Methodist Church until further notice:

- Masks MUST be worn in all worship services and while in our facilities.
- Worship services are limited to 80 people per service.
- Sign-ups for worship are required starting. You can register at phumc.com/worshipregistration.
- Social distancing practices must be followed.
- If you are immune compromised, even if you have been vaccinated, we encourage you to stay home and watch our services online or on television.

Childcare for worship services is available for babies through preschoolers with no registration. Sunday school classes can meet via Zoom or in-person at their own discretion. Youth and children's sunday school will take place from 10:10-10:50 in the youth and children's areas.



ANNUAL CONFERENCE 2021 UPDATE

Greetings from your lay and clergy members to the Arkansas Annual Conference. This year our conference was offered in a hybrid format, both in-person at Hot Springs, and via Zoom. As in the past, together as one body in Christ, we worshipped, prayed, conducted business and heard reports about the status of our United Methodist church. We were so fortunate that two morning worship services included our newest staff, Brooke Hobbs.

The Bishop's Episcopal address "The Gift of an Unexpected Pause," stressed opportunities local churches should take during the pause caused by a global pandemic and before the next General Conference meeting to: (1) strengthen congregations by praying, being bold, taking risks and being compassionate; (2) double-down on mission and (3) make Jesus the heart of everything the church does. Bishop Mueller noted that Jesus is not a "liberal" thing, Jesus is not a "conservative" thing, instead Jesus is God's thing for the world, for everyone.

We voted and passed a petition to engage in partnership with Project Transformation. This is a program that brings young teens and young children together, with the older mentoring and teaching the younger. The older teens have an opportunity to discern their gifts for ministry, while the younger children engage in learning opportunities. Dr. Robbins noted that his own son had engaged in this program and it had given his son direction into ministry.

Phoebe Sanders, ACCYM President, and a member of PHUMC presented the youth address via video. She spoke about the struggles that ACCYM had gone through in the past year, but the hope she felt about the future of the United Methodist Church as well as the welcome news of Project Transformation's partnership with the Arkansas Conference. More outstanding however, was the presentation to her of the Harry Denman Evangelism Award given out every year to two individuals, a youth and an adult recipient, who exemplify what it means to be a disciple in their own communities. Congratulations to Phoebe.

In a business session the conference voted on "A Resolution Regarding Decisions about Potential Separation, Departure, or Realignment as an Annual Conference" which passed after amendment. The resolution will bring together diverse ideological groups within the Arkansas Conference, including the Wesleyan Covenant Association/Confessing Movement, UMCNext/ Uniting Methodist, and the Black Methodist for Church Renewal, in a wide-ranging discourse concerning the potential vote of separation that could occur at General Conference 2022. Rev. Whitney said the goal was for people to come together in Christian conferencing to discuss their thoughts, feelings, anxieties, and more about the upcoming General Conference session.

We were privileged to hear Rev. Dr. Erin Beasley and Rev. Dr. F. Willis Johnson address the sin of racism and its manifestation in our churches. They noted the need to acknowledge racism, affirm that all people are of sacred worth, and to take action individually to initiate change. We also heard from the Rev. Dr. Michael Beck of Fresh Expressions US. Dr. Beck came to us via Zoom, and spoke on the mission of Fresh Expressions, which is to go into places where we don't normally think church can happen, and form relationships and connections with people in new ways. Some of the places that Rev. Dr. Beck mentioned where Fresh Expressions have popped up include tattoo parlors, burrito restaurants, dog parks, and virtual spaces. All these speakers challenged us to be intentional and as Dr. Robbins has noted in his sermons, get uncomfortable with being a Methodist.

Thank you to PHUMC for allowing me to attend and be a part of our connectional fabric.

PHUMC FOOD PANTRY UPDATES

The Judy Huddleston Strohm Food Pantry Ministry is happy to announce that an anonymous donor has committed to match donations from "Lovers of the Food Pantry" up to \$3,000. These funds will be the start of a new PHUMC Foundation endowment when total gifts reach a threshold of \$10,000.

As you have seen through various publications, the Food Pantry has been extremely active for many years in PHUMC's efforts to reduce food insecurity in the Greater Little Rock area. Church food donations have made this possible for more than 70 families who 'drive-through' for food distribution from 8:00-10:00 a.m. on the first Wednesday each month. Recently, the Food Pantry has also offered a Job Fair trying to match some of these clients, their families and friends with member and other local businesses.

This past month, the food pantry distributed 110 bags to 67 families! You can bring donations to Entrance 7 off of Lee Avenue from 7:30am-7:30pm Mondays-Friday! Or bring food with you on Sundays when you come to church! Our Food Pantry currently needs peanut butter, canned beans and canned meat with pasta (e.g spaghettios).
