Afghan Refugee Family Update

The father interviewed and was given a job at Baptist Health. Kuddos to them for giving him a job and accepting the fact that he is not yet an English-speaker!! He will make slightly more than minimum wage and so will continue to appreciate the support the family gets from 2nd Baptist and PHUMC. Two groups (the Argue Sunday School class and Brenda Mize's Christ Care group) have given nice donations to pay for the two older boys' Lake Nixon summer camp. We hope for donations to cover the rest so the balance of the Afghan Refugee Relief Fund, which is still not large, will continue to accumulate so we can share the cost of a vehicle with 2nd Baptist.

This month we want to recognize Tish DePriest. Tish serves as our leader on the Afghan Resettlement team. When asked about whether her faith moves her to service, she explained that she feels nudges that she has learned to put into action. This is not her first nudge; Tish has also been one of our Wakefield tutors. As you can see, Tish is driven into service that also allows her to be in relationship with others. Tish leads our PHUMC group of volunteers, and she is the key person in relationship with our partnering congregation at Second Baptist. She has transported to doctor's appointments, grocery stores, she has taken them to get clothing and to get haircuts. She is the primary ESL teacher for Mrs. S. She has helped to identify the furnishing and household needs and she has helped to facilitate donations from others. She attended the orientation for the elementary school and now she is planning for summer camp for the two older sons. Most important is the love that Tish shows in her interactions with this family. Her welcoming and loving spirit has obviously brought comfort to a family that so needed comfort and a feeling of safety. We'd also like to thank the individuals, the Sunday School classes, and the Christ Care groups that have been moved to help financially and with donations of books, clothing or with furnishings. If you or your small group would like to learn more about ways to assist, then don't hesitate to reach out to Tish. We continue to need assistance with transportation and our next financial challenges are related to the costs of summer camps and for a car to enable independence.

Wakefield Reading Tutors Needed For Next School Year!

After over two years of COVID restrictions preventing in-person tutoring, PHUMC plans to resume its tutoring program for reading at Wakefield Elementary in the fall of 2022. When we had to stop tutoring in March 2020, we had 40 tutors working with around 100 students at Wakefield. We would like to start the 2022-2023 school with a strong team so that we can help as many students as possible. The staff at Wakefield provides great support to the tutors, even providing a dedicated room supplied with resources in which several tutors can work with students at the same time. Tutors have an orientation session each year and work closely with the classroom teachers to make the most of the weekly half-hour spent with each child.

We always need new tutors, because, invariably, tutors have conflicts and need to be replaced, whether for a few weeks or several months. Having enough tutors allows us to maintain reading with the maximum number of Wakefield children. PHUMC tutors represent a variety of ages, from retirees to young parents whose children are in other elementary schools and single people who take time from their jobs to read with underserved students. Tutors schedule their preferred day and time to volunteer.

Now is the time to signal your interest in joining the team to read with a child or two or three, weekly, throughout the next year. This is a great way to live out the PHUMC mission statement, "Love God. Love Neighbor, Change the World." Helping students meet their academic potential through improved reading will affect their future success and happiness, thus changing the world! Tutoring rewards tutors as well as students and teachers, who greatly appreciate all PHUMC provides. Through the food pantry, backpacks, Christmas gifts and tutoring, PHUMC expresses a powerful ministry of loving our neighbors.
