Our fund is also providing the 6th grade son with professional English tutoring every week. He and his third grade brother also get twice weekly tutoring from Brenda Mize and Janet Stewart. All boys are doing well in LRSD schools.

Summer is here and the UWF have offered to support the boys in their summer camp endeavors. They love swimming and art and the third grader will attend wonderful Friendship Camp, which will be held at PHUMC this year. The family drove themselves to Memphis for a final meeting before they are issued their green cards. We and they are relieved that those cards should be in the mail soon. PHYOUTH LEADING & LEARNING PILGRIMAGE To kick off our summer, phyouth went on the inaugural Leading and Learning Pilgrimage—A series of trips designed to help our students understand justice issues that add to the complexity of being a leader and advocating for others.
